WHEREAS, the Trustees of the Freeholders and Commons Hampton are the owners in fee title of numerous bottomlands loca Hampton, including, but not limited to, Wainscott Pond, Georgica Fresh Pond, Hook Pond, Accabonac Creek and Harbor, Pussy's Po Harbor, Duck Creek, Hands Creek, Alewife Brook, Northwest Creek and;	ted in the Town of East Pond, Napeague Harbor ond, Hog Creek, Three M	, Iile

WHEREAS, in addition to the Trustees inherent powers as owners of said bottomland, the Trustees have the authority to regulate the construction and placement of all docks in these waters, and;

WHEREAS, the Trustees have determined that a review, assessment, and inventory of all existing docks, catwalks, floating docks, and floating structures is warranted in light of their current and future management goals for all Trustee bottomlands and waterways, and;

WHEREAS, the Trustees have determined that a one-year moratorium on all permitting and permitting approval for construction of any and all new docks, catwalks, floating docks, and floating structures is warranted, pending this review and assessment, and;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Trustees hereby enact a one-year moratorium on the permitting and permitting approval for construction of any and all new docks, catwalks, floating docks, and floating structures beginning as of November 22, 2021 through November 22, 2022, and;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this moratorium does NOT include any existing or future duck blind permitting as this resolution is not intended to affect the longstanding history of hunting from duck blinds in Trustee waters.
