## EMERGENCY DESIGNATION OF SHELLFISH LANDS IN THE STATE OF NEW YORK AS UNCERTIFIED FOR THE HARVEST OF SHELLFISH

Pursuant to the provisions of Subdivision 13-0307 (1) and (2) and Subdivision 13-0309 (1) of the Environmental Conservation Law and Sections 42.17 and 47.4 of Title 6 of the Official Compilation of Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York, and due to the increased potential for the contamination of shellfish lands from the discharge of sewage from marine sanitation devices aboard the large number of boats anchored and moored in Three Mile Harbor, serving as overnight living quarters, which may result in conditions causing shellfish harvested in the area to be hazardous for human consumption, I, Debra A. Barnes, Chief, Bureau of Shellfisheries, Division of Marine Resources, of the Department of Environmental Conservation, hereby designate the shellfish lands described below as **UNCERTIFIED**, effective at sunrise on Saturday, July 16, 2022, and continuing through Wednesday, July 20, 2022, both dates inclusive. **Accordingly, shellfish may not be harvested from the area described below.**

**Three Mile Harbor, Town of East Hampton:** All that area of Three Mile Harbor, including tributaries, located south of a line extending due east from the northern end of the western jetty at the inlet of Three Mile Harbor to the northern end of the eastern jetty, on the eastern side of said inlet.
